

When research involves Indigenous communities, Dalhousie has an obligation to ensure that this engagement is conducted in a good way, and in accordance with the Tri-Council Policy Statement, Chapter 9, Article 9.1: "Where the research is likely to affect the welfare of an Indigenous community, or communities, to which prospective participants belong, researchers shall seek engagement with the relevant community" and Article 9.2: "The nature and extent of community engagement in a project shall be determined jointly by the researcher and the relevant community and shall be appropriate to community characteristics and the nature of the research."

Researchers at Dalhousie University are required to have documentation confirming Indigenous community agreement/consent before starting any research with Indigenous communities. If this documentation is not yet in place and research funds are required to support early engagement with Indigenous Communities (e.g., toward developing an agreement for proposed, funded research), researchers can apply for a partial release of funds.
